This privacy statement relates to our privacy practices in relation to this website. We are not responsible for the content or privacy practices of other websites to which we provide links and external links are clearly identifiable as such. Some technical terms used in this statement are explained in the glossary below.

General Statement

The Coalition to Repeal the Eighth Amendment fully respects your rights and we will not collect any personal information about you without your clear permission. Any personal information which you volunteer will be treated with the highest standards of security and confidentiality as required under Directive 95/46/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 24 October 1995 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and in strict accordance with the Data Protection Acts, 1988 & 2003.

Collection and Use of Personal Information

Personal information for the purposes of this document is information that can identify an individual such as name, address or contact details. The Coalition to Repeal the Eighth Amendment does not collect any personal data about you on this website apart from information which you volunteer (for example by emailing us through our online contact form, by making a donation or by subscribing to receive further updates). Any information which you provide in this way is not provided to any third party unless this is expressly declared, and is used only in line with the purpose for which you provided it. Your personal data may also be anonymised and used for statistical purposes.

Collection and Use of Technical Information

Some features on this website will require you to enable 'cookies' in your browser. A cookie is a small file sent to your browser by the web server of a website that you visit. It usually contains a unique identifier so that when you re-visit that website, it can access the cookie it sent you to determine your particular site preferences. For example, the font size feature of this web site requires that you enable cookies in your browser (This is the only cookie used in the repealeight.ie site). Users have the opportunity to set their computers to accept all cookies, to notify them when a cookie is issued, or not to receive cookies at any time. If you choose to disable cookies in your browser, you will still be able to browse this website.

Technical details in connection with visits to our website are logged by our hosting company. This information may be used for statistical purposes and includes the IP address of the visitor's website, the web address from which the visitor contacted our website, visitor traffic (for example, the frequency at which particular web pages are accessed), and the type of web browser used by the visitor. None of this information can be used by us to establish the identity of visitors to our

website. This information does not constitute 'personal information' under the Data Protection Acts 1998 and 2003.

We will make no attempt to link this technical information to individual visitors. In addition, none of this information will be made available to a third party, apart from our hosting company (which is bound by confidentiality provisions). Such technical information is encrypted and password protected and is not available to visitors to our website.

Glossary of Technical Terms Used

- **web browser** - The piece of software you use to read web pages. Examples are Microsoft Internet Explorer, Netscape Navigator and Opera. Examples are Microsoft Internet Explorer, Mozilla FireFox, Google Chrome, Opera, Apple Safari, etc.
- **IP address** - The identifying details for your computer (or your internet company's computer), expressed in "internet protocol" code (for example 192.168.72.34). Every computer connected to the web has a unique IP address, although the address may not be the same every time a connection is made.
- **cookies** - Small pieces of information, stored in simple text files, placed on your computer by a website. Cookies can be read by the website on your subsequent visits. The information stored in a cookie may relate to your browsing habits on the web page, or a unique identification number so that the website can "remember" you on your return visit. Generally speaking, cookies do not contain personal information from which you can be identified, unless you have furnished such information to the website.
